

## **Policy on Retaking Classes**

Students are not permitted to retake classes which have been successfully completed (i.e., students received credit for the course by earning a D or above). In other words, students may not retake a course (with the same or a different instructor) and replace a previous grade. Moreover, students may not retake a course and have the same course on the transcript more than once. Students who enroll and retake a course will automatically be withdrawn from the second iteration of the course; and a W will appear on the transcript.

Students who fail a course or withdraw from a course (i.e., receives a W on the transcript for a course) must retake that same course if it is a Wharton requirement: Introductory Econ sequence, Math 104, Management 100, all business fundamentals.

Students who fail a course or withdraw from a course may elect to take a different course to fulfill the requirement under certain circumstances (e.g., societal environment courses (Legal Studies/BPUB 203) and organizational environment courses (Insr 205/Mgmt 104)). For example: A student who fails or withdraws from Lgst 101 has the flexibility to take Lgst 210 and Bpub 203 to fulfill the societal environment requirements. Similarly, a student can take Insr 205 or Mgmt 104 to fulfill the organizational environment requirement.

Students who fail or withdraw from writing seminars, business breadths, concentration courses or general education requirements also may elect to take a different course to fulfill the requirement under certain circumstances. Example: A student who fails or withdraws from Marketing 211 **MUST** retake Marketing 211 if it is being used in the concentration (because Marketing 211 is a concentration requirement); however, a student who is using Marketing 211 as a business breadth may elect to take a different course to fulfill the business breadth, keeping in mind other business breadth rules that affect a student's choice of courses.
